The risk of spreading any airborne virus can be reduced by improving general ventilation through fresh air (open windows and doors except fire doors to increase natural airflow) or mechanical systems. Air conditioning systems that mix some of the extracted air with fresh air and return it to the room can continue to be used as normal as this increases the fresh air ventilation rate.
