This major exhibition features beautiful Japanese woodblock prints from York Art Gallery's extensive collection, as well as iconic loans from regional and national institutions including Katsushika Hokusai's 'The Great Wave'. **Making Waves** explores the development of Japanese woodblock printing, revealing its origins and techniques and showing how artists responded to nature, society and cultural change through this incredible art form.
